## Plowing Forward in "2021" To Rebuild the Walls

As we begin the New Year of "2021" there is no doubt that many of us are saying <u>AMEN and AMEN to a NEW BEGINNING</u>. Truly GOD has been with us through this journey of the year 2020.

Though it has not been easy, we have now walked away from <u>2020</u> stating that it has been a year that has <u>tested our FAITH</u>, <u>crystalized our PRAYER LIFE</u>, and HOPEFULLY, it has moved us all to clearly understand what it means to <u>DEPEND ON OUR GOD</u> as the scripture states "give us this day our daily bread".

As we begin the new year, we must ask, "How can GOD use the <u>Partnering Churches of this Association</u> to impact the Kingdom of our GOD?" You may ask, "How can this be done amid the unknown during these difficult days?" Though these may be valid questions, we can rest assured that the Creator of the Heavens and the Earth is still sitting on the <u>Throne of GRACE</u> and <u>HE</u> stills <u>desires</u> for HIS Church to be about the <u>GREAT COMMISSION</u>.

With the help of our GOD, we are now planning Partnership Mission endeavors for our churches! We are needing a small group of NO more than 12 to go to San Diego, CA, where a new church is being started. The purpose is to deliver supplies for the new work as well as simple street ministry. We will be looking at a couple of other places, as well as an opportunity to adopt 3 of our Rural Communities in Partnership with the Local Churches of our Association represented in those communities to impact the community in love, calling it "LOVING OUR COMMUNITY". We will use the new Partnership Ministry Trailer of the Association of Churches. The dates and cost of all MISSION TRIP ENDEAVORS are still to be determined. Start getting prepared as we look toward 2021 Missions and to "get on the road again".

On March 13, a training event will be held at <u>Broadview Baptist Church, Lubbock</u> called <u>"Rebuilding the Walls of our Children and Youth Ministries"</u>. Every Church in our Association has been impacted by COVID-19. Most every church has less people attending than in the year of 2019. Many churches still do not have Sunday School/Small Groups on a regular basis. The church must go back to some normality in 2021. We must begin to <u>RE-BUILD</u> the <u>walls of Ministry</u>. There will be a morning and evening session allowing us to continue to social distance ourselves in the midst of the residual effects of COVID-19. This conference will be for Pastors and Key Leaders of the Children & Youth Ministries of the respective churches. We will limit the total amount of people allowed in the a.m. and p.m. session to <u>100-people</u> in each session. That will mean we can host 50 people in each part of the building thus allowing ourselves to SOCIAL DISTANCE. You must get your registration in early because of the limitations of space.

"I didn't see that coming!" I am sure if you are like me, you found yourself saying that phrase a lot in 2020. After many adjustments, we enter the new year with a renewed sense of vision. Your LABA staff has been busy getting ready to continue the good work God has given us to do. While we are still unsure how much longer all this will continue, we are ready to safely proceed with Gospel proclamation and we want to help you do the same.

Right now is a great time to do outreach events in each community God has placed us. We must continue to work diligently to reach those entering eternity without saving faith in Jesus Christ. In the past 6 months we have been working to provide outreach events to show people that we care. While many are uncertain about how safe it is to visit area churches, we have been taking the church to them.

This past July, we had a partnership led by FBC Lubbock, LABA Disaster Relief volunteers, and volunteers from area churches. Together we collaborated to feed almost 1,500 Covenant Hospital staff a hot meal prepared by mobile kitchens from the FBC Lubbock and LABA Disaster Relief mobile kitchens. Providing support was the new LABA Ministry Trailer. October 7<sup>th</sup>, 2020, we repeated the event by feeding almost 3,000 of the staff at UMC Hospital.

I mention the 2 LABA trailers because I want to emphasize the fact they are available to help our area churches have the equipment they need to do an outreach in their community. At a time in which we have been confined to our homes much of the time, many families are open to go outside and do something enjoyable. We set things up in a way that we can social distance. We do ask the volunteers to wear masks and to do things with the safety of the people we are serving in mind.

We have used the Ministry trailer twice and Feeding Kitchen once in the past 2 months at FBC Ralls. We used the LABA Ministry Trailer during our Trunk or Treat event. We made and gave out a lot of popcorn. We loved using the trailer so much, we reserved it again for our Neighborhood Christmas event. We used both the popcorn machines and one of the cotton candy machines. We also used the LABA Feeding Kitchen to bake 1,000 cookies to give out. I can hardly wait for it to get warm enough to use the snow cone machines as well!

I keep saying the LABA Ministry trailer and LABA Disaster Relief Feeding Kitchen. These trailers belong to the LABA. Who is the LABA? It is you, the member churches of The Association of Partnering Churches. Nothing gives us more joy than when churches partner together to do outreach events in their communities!!!

I am available in most cases to come work beside you and help with getting the trailers set up, the equipment operational, and to help make sure your volunteers are properly trained in how to use and clean the equipment. I want your experience using the tools God has given us to be positive and kingdom impacting.
